Our District Public Works Projects

You've probably seen your share of orange barrels around the 4th District this summer and fall. The city has completed a number of street, sewer and other public works projects in recent months, with more to come. Among the projects in the district:

- **Parkway Drive:** Resurfacing between Hickory and 15th was completed in October. Sewer improvements were completed this summer.
- **15th Avenue:** Resurfacing work, along with safety improvements near the middle and high schools, is planned for 2010. The work is being funded with federal stimulus money.
- **Nicholson/Pennsylvania:** Design work is underway on a potential widening project planned for 2011-12.

Residents to Vote at Rawson Elementary School

Starting with the next election, all 4th District voters will cast their ballots at Rawson Elementary School, 1410 Rawson Avenue. No longer will votes be cast at South Milwaukee Middle School. This is part of a broader effort to consolidate city polling places.
