

At 8:43 PM on Saturday evening we received a 911 call for a house fire at 901 Monroe Avenue. The caller stated that people were still in the home. Due to possible trapped occupants this call was upgraded enroute to a Working Still, which we received mutual aid from Cudahy, Greendale, Oak Creek, and St. Francis Fire Departments. On SMFD's arrival we found fire coming from the second floor windows on the south side of the building. Also on arrival SM Dispatched notified us that all occupants were out of the home, this was confirmed by SMPD on arrival. Shortly after the Working Still Companies arrived and committing them to the fire scene the alarm was updated again and we received additional help on the scene from Caledonia, Franklin, Greenfield, and West Allis Fire Departments. Raymond and Hales Corners Fire Departments manned our station during the incident, with Raymond responding to two ambulance calls in the city.

One fire fighter was injured when a sheet of drywall fell from the ceiling hitting him in the head which compromised his face mask. He was removed from the building but did not require additional medical treatment. An occupant of the home was also treated and transported to the hospital by Raymond Fire Departments Ambulance.

The three families that resided in the home will be displaced due to the extensive fire damage to the second floor and attic area. The first floor and basement received only water damage. At this time the fire is still under investigation by SMFD and SMPD.
